The UK MS Register was launched eighteen months ago to record the experiences of individuals with Multiple Sclerosis which would provide a valuable tool for Researchers. Since then about 10,000 people with MS (PWMS) have joined the Register and we are hoping to encourage more PWMS to volunteer their experiences. There may be PWMS who would like to register but do not have a computer or are not confident about accessing the Register and we will have Volunteers on hand to assist them.

The event will begin with a talk on the Register. This will be followed by practical sessions on how to access the Register and record the requested information. This will be done in such a way that details will be recorded confidentially. PWMS will be encouraged to return to

the Register every couple of months to record their current experience of what it is like to live with MS.




