Programmed works

We are proposing to commence works on Monday 7 October 2019 and anticipate completion during November.

To ensure the safety of the public and our teams, traffic management will be put in place by our contractors, Inverness Paving. This will include temporary lane closures and parking restrictions along Pitfour Street.

We will not be interrupting your electricity supply to carry out these works.
